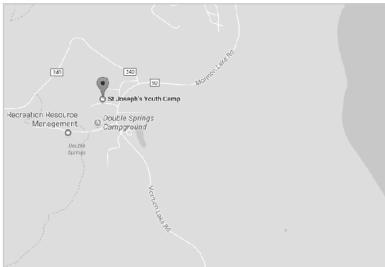

**WHEN:** OCTOBER 10-13, 2024

**WHERE:** ST. JOSEPH'S YOUTH CAMP, MORMAN LAKE, AZ

**DIRECTIONS:**



**Using I-17 towards Flagstaff**

North on I-17 towards Flagstaff. Take Lake Mary Road exit 339. Make a right hand turn and follow Lake Mary Road. Around mile post 324, you will find Mormon Lake Road. There will be a brown sign pointing the way to Mormon Lake Lodge. Turn right onto Mormon Lake Road. Follow Mormon Lake Road until you reach Saint Joseph's Youth Camp (between mile post 5 & 6) which will be located on your right hand side.

**Using Highway 87 through Payson**

Follow Highway 87 through Payson until you reach the Clint Wells turn-off. Turn left onto Lake Mary Road. Stay on Lake Mary Road for about 27 miles. You will be around the 317 mile post. Look for a large brown sign pointing the way to Mormon Lake Lodge. Turn left onto Mormon Lake Road. Follow the road until you reach Saint Joseph's Youth Camp (between mile post 5 & 6) which will be on your left hand side.

**CAMPING:** We will have limited RV parking in camp and plenty of room if you will be tent camping. If you have a group we have a few bunk houses available, these are group bunk houses. (Call for Information). Note: AES will be providing dinner 10/10 and lunch on Friday 10/11 and Saturday 10/12.

**MEALS:** 3 FREE MEALS: Family Dinner at 5:00 pm, Thursday, Lunch at Noon on Friday and Saturday

### THURSDAY OCTOBER 10TH – DINNER WILL BE SERVED STARTING AT 5:00 PM. SEMINARS START 6PM/6:30PM

The AES will provide hamburgers and refreshments at 5:00 pm on Thursday evening to youth hunters and their families. Hunters and their family are welcome to stop by at noon each day for lunch and refreshments. We will be in camp available throughout the weekend, bring your maps, we will help you hunt, locate elk or retrieve downed elk. There will be an archery range setup for the kids to learn about bowhunting and practice shooting the bows.

Representatives from the AZGFD as well as the Coconino Forest Service will be on hand. Arizona Game & Fish officers will give a presentation on hunting safety. A Game Processor will also give a short seminar on meat care and preparation. Local guides will talk about locating elk and answer questions.

The Arizona Elk Society with sponsorship from Arizona Game & Fish, Miller Southwest Processing, Cabela's, St. Joseph's Youth Camp, Sportsman's Warehouse, Bass Pro Shops and more will have free door prizes and give-a-ways for the youth hunters participating in the seminar.

- SEMINAR:**
- Safety while in the field hunting. (Wearing orange is recommended).
  - ATV or OHV rules and regulations, and safety issues.
  - Information from the AZG&F and USFS regarding hunting rules and regulations.
  - Forest Service Travel Management information.
  - Proper meat care, gutting and skinning techniques.
  - Tracking, spotting and locating elk. Proper use of elk calls

**Please remember that time is of the essence when retrieving downed animals. The quicker you get the hide off and the meat to the processor the better your meat will be and the more meat you will save.**
